# Campground Rules

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) facility rules provide a safe, enjoyable experience for everyone while protecting natural resources.

## **Site Occupancy**

### Check in is 2 p.m. and check out is 11 a.m.

- Maximum site occupany for individual sites is 6 individuals. Check Group Site information for group site occupancy.
- Site fees include one vehicle with one towed camper, or one RV, per site. Additional fees are charged for additional vehicles when space allows. Double sites are charged as two sites. Sitefees include county Transient Occupancy Tax, if applicable.
- Campsites need to be occupied, by at least one person, the first night and may not be left unattended for more than 24 hours without permission from the campground host.
- Please make sure all vehicles, tents and equipment are contained within your site, assigned site spur or in designated parking areas.
- Fees are not transferable to other campsites within the campground or to other recreation facilities unless approved by campground host.
- If you wish to extend your stay, please check with the campground host for availability.
- Please observe the 14-day stay limit and six-person occupancy per site.
- If a reservation site is not reserved, it can be used for first come first serve for up to 3 days with campground host's permission. See host for details.

# **Environmental Stewardship**

# You may use any dead wood for fuel; but do not cut or damage living trees or saplings.

- Do not alter water bodies or waterways (streams) in any manner, including damming the flow of water, placing, or removing materials from the banks or channel, and damaging or removing vegetation from the banks or channel.
- Personal/portable outside showers are not allowed within the campground.
- RV drain outlets must always be capped including gray water.
- Help conserve water and keep the water supply safe; do not clean fish, bathe, or wash items at faucets or in water bodies.
- Keep wildlife wild by not feeding them and by maintaining a clean campsite.
- Help preserve site vegetation and soils, keep vehicles on designated roadways and use existing trails.
- Preserve our shared history, do not remove or disturb cultural, or historical, resources.
- Quagga and zebra mussels from the Eastern US are devastating for our lakes, reservoirs, and rivers. If you've visited infested waters, check your boat and equipment for the mussels.
- Please leave your site as you found it, so that others may enjoy it after you leave!

# **Campground Courtesy and Safety**

Quiet Hours are from 10 p.m. to 8 a.m. Please do not operate generators, vehicles, audio equipment, talkloudly, or make noise that could interfere with those sleeping.

- Visitors who do not respect the rights and privacy of other campground visitors, engage in behavior that negatively impacts others' use and enjoyment of the recreation facility (e.g., excessive noise, unsolicited photography, infringing on others' campsites, etc.), or do not follow campground rules, may be asked to leave the campground without refund.
- California vehicle Code applies to all vehicles, including bicycles. Vehicles must observe the 5-mph speed limit and travel in the direction posted. Pedestrians have the right of way. Street legal vehicles may be operated to enter or exit the facility. OHV non-street legal vehicles are not to be operated in PG&E facilities.
- Vehicles are to remain on developed roads and designated parking areas.
- Recreational vehicles may be unloaded at facilities and driven slowly, or walked, to entrance.
- Campfires and charcoal grill fires may be prohibited at any time by PG&E, the campground host, or other PG&E representative's assessment of fire risk.
- For safety reasons, the use of fireworks, chainsaws, firearms, bows and arrows is prohibited within or near recreation areas.
- This recreation facility is a benefit of PG&E's hydroelectric system.

- Help prevent forest fires. Campfires are only allowed where designated and must be supervised at all times. Fully extinguish fires and properly put out and dispose of cigarettes, pipes, and matches when leaving the site.
- Please do not throw trash in toilets; deposit garbage or recycling in the containers provided. Properly disposing of trash will help prevent issues with the wildlife and reduce expense. Do not put ashes in garbage cans—campground hosts will remove ashes and dispose of as needed.
- To protect public safety, this facility may be closed at any time.
- Maximum of 2 domestic pets are allowed per campsite for a fee, where applicable. They must be vaccinated and leashed. Owners are responsible for cleaning up after their pets and maintaining control (no incessant barking or leaving unattended) at all times within the campground and/or trails.
- All cigarettes, pipes and matches need to be fully extinguished and properly disposed.
- RV's may park in paved parking area.
- Secure all food (including dry goods and beverages) to prevent access by wildlife.
- Outdoor showers are not allowed.
- Filling of water tanks at campground spigots are not allowed.
